Approach to Establishing Jurisdictions

• CMS designed the new MAC jurisdictions to:

- Balance the allocation of workloads
- Promote competition
- Account for integration of claims processing activities
- Mitigate risk during transition to MACs





Approach to Establishing Jurisdictions – cont.

• Result:

- Reasonably balanced number of fee-forservice beneficiaries
- Reasonably balanced number of providers or suppliers
- Size and workload not identical





MAC Jurisdictions

Primary A/B MACs

- 15 jurisdictions
 - Distinct geographically
 - Non-overlapping

MAC Jurisdictions - cont. • Specialty MACs • 4 Jurisdictions • 4 Durable Medical Equipment (DME) MACs

- ► 4 Home Health/Hospice (HH) MACs
- Jurisdictions are identical for both specialties
- Overlay boundaries of 15 Primary A/B MACs
